Back Together Again

In just a few weeks, I will fly back to Denver to finish packing our home into a truck and moving our whole family to San Diego. After 18 months, we are ready to start new adventures together. It will be a busy couple of weeks as everyone who has ever moved knows. You'll see Art and meet Lance for the first time in early March.

I'm so excited that on January 22 we welcomed Rev. Portia Howard to our church family as our new Minister for Congregational Care. She is an absolute delight and you will enjoy getting to know her. She will work collaboratively with the Diaconate and Prayer Ministry to facilitate the loving care of our congregation for one another. Our program staff had a Saturday retreat just in time to incorporate her onto our team of amazing individuals.

In a few days our Youth Group led by Fiona Case will cross the border to build a home for a family in Tijuana. Twenty-five youth, parents, and other church members will represent all of us as the hands of Christ. We asked you for \$6,500 for the cost of building the house. In three weeks, you donated more than \$8,000, minus some expenses for the Fine Dining Experience they provided, which means we can also provide the new homeowners with linens, a propane stove, and other useful items. It was fantastic to both watch the servers and taste the delicious food they made. We can't wait to see the pictures of the new house. Please pray for their safety as they travel to and from on February 4 and 5.

Lent is around the corner and will begin with Ash Wednesday on February 22. We will have a brief service for the imposition of ashes in our courtyard at Noon and then that evening, have a joint worship service and supper at one of the Partnership churches – to be determined. It will both be in person and online. Then Ken Jensen, one of our Members in Discernment on his ordination journey, will lead a five week series on a Progressive Christian's response to God's Earth – each Monday evening, mostly on Zoom.

I'm celebrating 30 years of ordination this month. On February 5th I will share what it was like to be ordained as one of the first openly gay pastors called to a church. God has been good, as God always is.

But right now, I'm grateful to soon be back together with my family again!

Moderator Message

If you have happened to glance at the list of upcoming events for MHUCC (included in the Sunday service bulletin and in the Mission Minute), you might have noticed there is a Council Retreat scheduled for February 11th.

The purpose for this event is not just a social event or even a continuation of regular council business. The purpose is to start talking about the future of the church and how to best structure church leadership and organization so we function effectively well into this second century of the church's existence.

It is easy to look at how our church is operating now and go with the popular saying, "... if it ain't broke, don't fix it!" That's understandable to feel that way as our church is doing well compared to many in this somewhat post-pandemic time. But it is always good to look at operations of any group or organization and ask can we do it any better, any easier, and/or more flexibly. And the bigger question, if we are able to somewhat streamline the basic operations could that free us up to give time and attention to people, mission, and community?

Coincidentally (or not – when one least expects it, God can move in mysterious ways), Neil Senturia's recent column in the business section of the San Diego Union-Tribune on 1/23/23 discussed lessons for innovators proposed by a Nobel Prize winning economist Daniel Kahneman. But wait, can business or economist lessons apply to a house of God?? Good question and in some cases, I can see how they can apply. See what you think... Here were some of the lessons brought out in the article:

The Illusion of Understanding – this was described as fitting past events into a satisfying story, thinking we understand why things were done a certain way, and not imagining it turning out differently. If we have always done or arranged things a certain way, how could it possibly be done differently? Or could things perhaps be done even better, clearer, or easier?

The Illusion of Pattern – This was giving meaning or a specific reason to events that were just random or by chance. We always have done certain things at specific times and in certain ways – was there a reason for this to start with or this just by chance that we did it that way? If it was just by chance or by habit, could there be a better way to do things?

Extreme Predictions – the article explained this (in a business perspective) as "No, your company is not going to be the next Google." Perhaps for a church this could be rephrased as *No, your church is not going to be the next area Mega-church*. I tend to think this is unlikely to be any of our hopes or aspirations for MHUCC. But, aspiring to be the "greatest attendance church around" wouldn't seem to be what our highest hopes should be...

Finally the last lesson seems to really hit home in terms of church to me – Overconfidence -- The newspaper article states “The illusion of validity lets us make huge bets with blind confidence. .. But let’s get real.”

The bible has something to directly to say about this – Proverbs 16:18 (RSV): “Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall.”

Also, Isaiah 5:21 “Woe to those who are wise in their own eyes and clever in their own sight.”

Finally, Romans 12:16 “Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation.”

We have to walk a line between making decisions based on our best judgement and experience but still listening for the spirit of God to lead us.

Wishing you a blessed February, a Happy Valentine’s Day in whatever way you celebrate it, and, to end on a high note – remember its less than eight weeks to the start of spring. :)


