The Church is Stronger Together

MHUCC is blessed by strong relationships with sibling churches in the UCC. In March we celebrated 40 years together as six UCC Partnership Churches in San Diego, established in 1983 among racially and ethnically diverse congregations. The makeup of the churches has shifted over the years but the desire to be in relationship has not. We have a history of marching together in Pride and the MLK Parade, studying the UCC's white privilege curriculum, pulpit exchanges, picnics, youth programming, and services during Lent. The pastors and a lay representative from each church meet every other month. Carol Vaughan is our representative.

Last weekend, we hosted 80 leaders from our six churches at MHUCC along with staff members from our Southern California Nevada Conference UCC. Attendees represented church councils and leaders of other boards or ministries from each church. We came together to understand the changing dynamic of church life in our post-pandemic age and how to be faithful to God's call for our future. We are stewards of a strong legacy. These conversations will help shape how we update our leadership structure. Much more on this is to come.

Also ongoing among our Partnership – we just had an overnight with youth at Kensington UCC. All of our churches are working together on our commitment to racial justice, equity, and inclusion. Listen for more opportunities to get connected. And we are planning an anniversary celebration at Mission Bay in the Fall. And during Holy Week, if you would like to participate in an Easter Vigil on Saturday night, University City United Church invites anyone from our Partnership to attend.

Blessings to us all for a meaningful and holy observance of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

Moderator Message

I wasn't planning on doing another "in memoriam" type of message this month but circumstances dictated otherwise. In early March I received a phone call from Elizabeth Quiñones letting me know that church member and long time Sunday School teacher Mike Groby had passed away. It was completely unexpected and such a shock, I almost found it hard to believe at first. As I called and informed several other people from church that knew Mike well, it came as a shock to all of us. Mike was not overly social with other adults at church except for those of us that assisted him in the Sunday School classroom but he was unflinching pleasant and, if he knew you, he would always greet you warmly and ask how you were doing.

Mike was a man of great faith and took communion most every week without fail. From what I knew personally and what I have learned more about online – Mike had two areas of great passion in his life – one was umpiring amateur softball, and the other was working with children – both a career in education (especially working with children learning to read) and leading Sunday School classes and sharing his faith with children.

I was aware of Mike's work as a softball umpire but he was modest and never boasted of the number of years he umpired or how revered he was in the sport. I learned online that he had previously been inducted into the Halls of Fame for two different groups – America's Finest City Softball League and North American Gay Amateur Athletic Alliance. People online commented about the dramatic and exuberant calls he made as an umpire and what joy he always brought to the game. Players referred to Mike as "my favorite umpire", and "I loved it when he would scream foul – he made the game fun", and "He was one of a kind."


Mike made an equally indelible mark with the numbers of children who were in his Sunday School classes over the years. The sheer joy he had for each and every kid in the class was evident every time. He knew everyone's name in class and something about each one. He would start each class reminding kids of the simple classroom rules and then would always ask each child to share something about their week. He listened to each one and showed such respect and care for the kids. They responded and enjoyed Mike's instruction and stories. He shared his faith honestly



and frequently with the kids and gave a lot of attention to every lesson. He always ended the classes telling the children he would be praying for them. Earlier in March all the Sunday School teachers met with the kids to talk about Mike's death and they all had something to share about Mike. I was particularly touched by one comment that "... now Mike will be with his sister in heaven." During the class that morning they all made cards to remember Mike and say how he touched their lives. These cards are just beautiful and I would encourage you to take a look at them as they are posted on a bulletin board in the hallway outside the Fellowship Hall.

*I will conclude with a comment borrowed from a former softball player about Mike –
"May he rest in peace and know he was loved."*

Monthly Mission Partner– MHUCC Monthly Food Distribution



For over 12 years, MHUCC, in association with Special Delivery/ Ruth and Bob Hendricks, have operated a food distribution for the church parking lot on the third Tuesday of every month. This is operated rain (example – the recent March 2023 distribution) or shine. We serve a number of people who are food insecure in the general vicinity including a number of low-income seniors. We typically serve 150 or more customers every month. With the cost of living and particularly food costs increasing lately, there are frequently lines of people a half a block long or longer waiting for the food bags to be distributed on any distribution Tuesday.

For all of the years these distributions have taken place, the church has purchased a protein food item for each customer (typically canned tuna, canned chicken, or a jar of peanut butter) funded faithfully and generously by an annual allocation of the Mission and Outreach Ministry budget.

Prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, remaining food was secured through Feeding San Diego (the local affiliate of Feeding America) and included some packaged and canned foods and some produce. The produce arrived in large grocery store sized bins which had to be sorted and repackaged to give out to customers. This required a large number of volunteers and also involved a lot of clean up. The quality of the produce was sometimes poor requiring the disposal of bad food. We were left with pallets and large boxes to dispose of or recycle after the distribution.

This mode of distribution had to be changed once Covid restrictions began as we could not have as close of contact with customers and couldn't have large groups of volunteers working closely together. In consultation with Ruth Hendricks, an alternative model was developed. Ruth could obtain high quality bulk produce for us through a wholesale restaurant supplier, her husband Bob agreed to pick it up and deliver it to the church parking lot early on the distribution days, and a smaller group of volunteers could pack grocery bags with an assortment of fresh fruits and vegetables plus a protein food. Customers could just pick up a packed bag from tables. This is the program that we now refer to as Feeding Mission Hills.

An initial generous donation from a MHUCC member made it possible to start this in April 2020 and, due to continuing donations from both church members and community members, this program keeps on bringing healthy fresh food to people who really need it every month. If we have any leftover filled grocery bags at the end of a distribution, the surplus is taken to First Congregational Towers for their residents. There is never any food wasted or thrown out.

If you would wish to contribute to the food distributions, you can make a donation of cash or check (payable to MHUCC with food program on the memo line) in the special donation envelope in the pews or online. We are grateful for the support and generosity of so many.

SUNDAY SCHOOL



The kids were involved in participating in answering the survey that Faith Formation had created. Faith Formation came during the Sunday School and the kids did really well in answering the questions.

Two weeks ago, we learned that one of our Sunday School teachers, Mike, passed away and on March 5th, the children wrote letters to him. One of the volunteers from the Trauma Intervention Programs came to give support to us and brought stuffed toys to each child.



We – the children, families, and Sunday School teachers - went to Mission Hills Nursery for a field trip. We learned different kinds of plants and trees, met their chicken pets, and enjoyed popcorn while doing the tour.



The Church is Stronger Together – Part 2





History Corner: Let's Go to the Movies!

Since we have just finished the Academy Awards for 2023, it might be interesting to look back about 100 years. Did you know that in the 1920's, our church showed Hollywood movies for the public, - charging a small fee? In the first 8 months of 1926, we spent \$286 to rent these films, and the receipts were \$318. Council felt that the program would be more successful and attract more non-congregants if we showed "more familiar motion pictures with better known actors." The most popular films of 1926 included the silent films "The General" with Buster Keaton and "Flesh and the Devil" with Greta Garbo. No word on whether these movies were rented.
