Janine Young, MD, FAAP, is an academic general pediatrician at the University of California San Diego and Division Chief of Academic General Pediatrics, Newborn Medicine, and Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics. Her career focus is health care and access to care for immigrants and refugees. She has written widely and presented talks nationally regarding topics that include the development of standard of care, Immigrant Health medical screening guidelines, the evaluation and treatment of unaccompanied children, pediatric female genital cutting diagnosis, treatment and prevention, and medical-immigration law partnerships.




We're delighted to have them aboard!
