On the Cusp

When I first read MHUCC's bylaws during my interviews, I had a feeling this would be my third church in a row to go through major revisions of its governance structure. The bylaws at my last church required 60 "slots to fill" and never enough people willing. Sixty seems small compared to MHUCC! They essentially changed the bylaws by not fulfilling its obligations. But when it came to actually intentionally adopting new bylaws, people weren't... let's just say that some folks were reluctant to get on board. At first. It was a big change. And not everything we envisioned worked. But when it came time to make a decision about being one of 14 churches providing a meal and overnight shelter for 20 women 26 night a year, whereas we couldn't get 60 people to commit to serving on a committee, 94 people volunteered – involving 40 jobs per month. Neighbors even joined in.

Since we first discussed it at our MHUCC Council retreat, I have been waiting for reluctance to emerge. Most churches do not easily embrace such a big change. There have been some excellent questions about "how" things will get done, but not fear. You continually amaze me with your enthusiasm about our church's future and how ready you are to welcome new ideas and approaches to set a firm foundation for those yet to come.

At the same time, we have been embracing some long lost traditions, including a weekend retreat at Pilgrim Pines. Registration closes on October 1, but one week out, we have 59 registered, including 18 kids who we hope will fall in love with Pilgrim Pines. The retreat comes two days after my two year anniversary as your pastor. I feel so incredibly blessed and grateful for your continued warm embrace. Thank you!

Moderator Message

Our church governance has been in place for many years. Last year, when I became vice-moderator and therefore tasked with heading the nominating committee to fill positions for the coming year, it was a challenge. Many of the positions were not filled from the previous year and there were a decreasing number in the congregation who were willing to make a three year commitment to serve on a ministry.

In February, at our retreat, the Church Council decided to explore a new governance structure that would give us more flexibility, encourage more congregational participation and still get the work done.

In order for that new structure to become a reality, a team came together and began their work. It's a shining example of our move from ministries to teams. This group came together to accomplish a specific task and that task is now nearing completion.

Accepting the fact that change is not easy for any of us, we wanted our governing structure to be more workable and at the same time ensure that avenues of communication were open and reliable, and that the work that needed to be done was in fact, accomplished. The team met nearly every week, thinking out loud, accepting some ideas and tossing out others....there was lots of "How would this work?" and also "What do you think about this?"

The team leaders had open meetings with the congregation to present ideas and accept feedback. That feedback was brought back to the team and incorporated into the structure. Council also provided valuable feedback. When we had a workable structure, we set about modifying the Bylaws to incorporate the new structure and to provide more flexibility to governance.

It's September, 7 months later, and I'm happy to report that our task is in the final stages. We accept that there may continue to be changes, but we're ready to move forward. This huge task would not have been possible without the unrelenting determination of Pat Wahlen, Karen DeLaurier, Carol Holt, and Pastor David. as well as Jon Pettis, who is to be commended for his work on the Bylaws.

After the service on Sunday, October 8, there will be an important congregational meeting to vote on approval of the revised bylaws. Your participation is important. Please plan to attend.

I am grateful to all the members of the team and look forward to the months ahead as we move forward.




We will gather in the parking lot on **Saturday, October 7** to bless the animal members of our families.

Snacks and munchies will be provided with a variety of juice and soda too! You're invited to bring your own beer to imbibe (if desired) as we sing our favorite hymns together.







All Generations Pumpkin Carving and Decorating




Monthly Mission Partner UCC Neighbors in Need


