A group of friends came with her and we talked after the concert. She asked, "were any members of your church in the choir?" I told them, "This *is* our church choir. And they sing like that every Sunday. You should come and check it out!"

Or maybe it was the mom on the last day of Christmas Carol Camp who repeatedly expressed gratitude for this opportunity for her children. She had grown up in the church and said, "We've been looking for a church like this," but hadn't actually done anything to look — until her neighbor told her about our camp and encouraged her to enroll her kids. It was music to my ears to hear "See you Sunday" and actually see her family in the pew. Participation in the camp increased from last year but even better, unlike last year, every family came to church for their kids to sing as well as go to Green Manor to carol for the residents.

I am writing this before Christmas Eve so I can only assume services on December 24 were as wonderful and meaningful as the rest of Advent.

After a year of very measured and deliberate work to imagine and write new bylaws, the new year will bring lots of change as we begin to implement our new structure. Our Church Council will now have 10 members instead of 22. A group of members will take on the role of Conveners with teams to carry out our ministry in new and hopefully more collaborative ways. We get to be creative and imaginative as we figure out how to continue traditions as well as create new ones. There is more I could say about this, but it can wait until we have fully appreciated the wonder and joy of an inclusive Christian community in a divided world.

#### **Lots of Someones**

Our church is filled with activity and excitement every Sunday morning. In the narthex, friends are sharing the latest news, fellowship hall being prepared for coffee hour, the choir is warming up as they prepare for the service, it's a buzz with energy. However, it's not just a busy place on Sunday.

If you visit the church anytime during the week, you will find the same energy and activity. Things are happening all week long by members of the congregation who devote their time, energy and expertise to activities within the building and beyond.

### Focus on People 50ish and Beyond

In 2022 MHUCC completed and implemented its findings for the direction of our programs with children, youth, and families. Parents, children, youth, and members participated in a survey and focus groups to tell us what was important to them. Their feedback was extremely helpful. And our thanks to Artcel, Fiona and teachers for effectively putting that new direction into action.

Now the next step. The Life Stages Work Group has been gathering data and survey information from churches about their offerings to people 50ish and beyond. Nationwide there has been major growth of church offerings in this area, especially with 1 in 5 people being over 65 by 2030. We are a strong congregation in most age bands, but particularly in 55+.

Our next step is finding out what is important to people in our congregation who are 50ish and beyond. In mid-January you will be receiving a survey for you to tell us what is important to you. It will be an online survey and the survey team will provide assistance if you need it. The results will be shared with the congregation.

When you receive the survey, please take the time to complete it. It will help MHUCC know about the interests, activities, and support to provide for people in the second half of their lives.



# History Corner: 2024 is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our church organ!

Alice Cowles Doane (wife of our first Pastor John Doane) and her sister Mary Flagler Cowles presented the organ to the church in memory of their late mother Lois Mary Cowles. The dedicatory service was held on September 28, 1924. As we go through 2024, we will be celebrating this anniversary with several special concerts and receptions. This column will share interesting historical facts about the organ and its vital place in our worship.

The organ was constructed by the Austin Organ Company of Hartford, Connecticut, at a cost of over \$10,000. Austin Organ Co. is one of the oldest continuously operating organ manufacturers in the United States, their first organ having been built in 1893. Most significantly for San Diegans, Austin built the Spreckles Pavilion Organ in Balboa Park in 1914, just 10 years before they built the Mission Hills Congregational organ.
