## Pacific Islander and Asian American Heritage Month

Black History Month is always a meaningful month in worship featuring music and readings and inspiring stories. For the last two years, our worship staff team has wondered about celebrating the heritage of our Asian and Pacific Islander members – a growing segment of our church. So we're happy to announce:

On April 28 we began by singing Japanese and Chinese hymns, the choir sang a Korean folk song, and Susan Namba, a member of our partner church, Pioneer Ocean View UCC, talked with us about the history of the Japanese church started by First Congregational in the late 1800s.

May 5 will be special because it is Youth Sunday and they will lead the whole service, including sermons. We will also honor the heritages of India and Sri Lanka. The choir will sing a traditional Hindi melody and the Lord's Prayer that day will be a Sanskrit translation.

*Lord, you are our Parent who lives in heaven;  
Let your name be sung, and may we have love for it.  
May your reign also be established here on earth.

And on Pentecost, May 19, the focus will be on Pacific Islands like the Philippines and Samoa with special music by our members. Also that day, we will enjoy foods provided by our Filipino, Chinese, and Samoan members after worship. It will be a wonderful way to conclude our celebration.

I have long envisioned our beautiful church building as a gathering place for a variety of activities in our community. Center Stage Children's Theatre has used our hall and stage for many years. Some of our youth are graduates of the program and some are involved now. Last year I attended a production. A young girl who lives across the street was in the show. It was delightful. The productions bring audiences from throughout the county. This year, ***Alice in Wonderland*** will be presented on May 10, 11 and 12. There are a variety of community groups that use our space. Not only are we providing a venue but their rent provides revenue for the church. There have been birthday celebrations, as well as quinceañeras. Grant School has various activities, There are diabetes classes, anonymous groups, Zeta Rho Women's Study Group, the Mission Hills Garden Club. There is a community art fair in the works for the fall. Our tenants upstairs share our goal of feeding the hungry.

Recently I received an email from the Pioneer Philharmonic Orchestra, a newly formed organization in our community. They were looking for a space to practice. I met with the leader, who much to my surprise and delight is a ninth grade student at Point Loma High School. He has gathered a group of other teens who live nearby to form an orchestra. This enterprising young man followed through with all the paperwork and as a result, he and his orchestra began practicing in the chapel on Saturday afternoons. They will be continuing for a series of practice sessions. And in lieu of paying rent, they have agreed to play for the congregation. Who knows where this all will end. There are many possibilities. I do think it says something about our church, that a teenager would feel comfortable asking for a practice place and think we'd say "Yes, come on in." We are a welcoming congregation, in every sense, providing a gathering space for all. A recent email from the orchestra's director, again expressed his appreciation.

JIT helps them become Confident, Capable and Connected, with the combination of critical resources and essential relationships that every young person needs. This month you will hear stories from youth whose lives have been changed by JIT and will learn ways to donate time, treasure and/or talents to this important work.






