Welcome Home!

Although people travel all year round, there is kind of a return to routine in the fall, starting with the return to school. We celebrated our annual Blessing of the Backpacks on August 18. It's one of my favorite ceremonies of the year. Another important marker of time is our annual Homecoming Sunday on **September 8**. We encourage everyone to mark your calendar and fill the sanctuary that day. This will also mark the return of our choir, now just months away from their trip to sing in Carnegie Hall at the end of November. Speaking of that, many thanks to all the volunteers who put together an awesome fundraising evening of food, entertainment, and silent auction. The entertainment made up of our talented members was so popular, I hope we can do a simple talent show every year!

We have added a Homecoming Dance this year – a 50's Sock Hop on **Saturday, September 14 from 5-7**, sponsored by our Children and Families Ministry. Find your poodle skirts and letter jackets and enjoy our DJ and diner-style food. Tickets are only \$8 in advance, \$10 at the door, and a maximum of \$25 per family. Any money beyond expenses will support our upcoming All Generations Weekend at Pilgrim Pines – **October 18-20**.

By the way, now is the time to register for Pilgrim Pines – deadline September 29. Our return to the UCC camp in the San Bernardino Mountains after more than a decade absence was a huge hit last year and I hope you will want to be part of this all-age and family experience. We try to keep the cost affordable – only \$150/person or a maximum of \$300 per family, including meals and lodging. The difference between the cost and our income is supplemented in two ways – the Men's Group is doing a pancake breakfast fundraiser before church on **September 29** and the rest comes from our Faith Formation Fund. This year we will have a van leave from church on Friday evening for those who wish to avoid driving, but you have to sign up sooner than later. And just talk to me if you would like some additional assistance to make it affordable enough for you.

The biggest thing this month is the culmination of our organ centennial during worship on **September 22**. The choir will debut a piece commissioned for Mission Hills along with organ, handbells, and saxophone. I can't wait to hear it! Our "mission partner" in September will be to ensure our organ's future for another 100 years – or maybe a decade!

If you have been away or haven't been regular for a while, please accept my invitation to come on Homecoming and worship with your church community.



Prior to the 2020 election, Pastor David compiled a collection of prayers and poems to countdown, every day lifting a hopeful vision of the world, guided by our faith and a hunger for the world Jesus proclaimed.

Starting September 26, you will receive an email every day with a prayer or poem – a way to center ourselves, ease anxiety, and express our hope for a world that is open, inclusive, just, and compassionate. We will also have printed copies in booklet form and each day's prayer will be recorded and posted online.

FAITH ON FOOT

Jesus was a walker. He and his closest followers walked for countless miles over the span of his ministry. One can imagine that many of his parables would have occurred to him and taken shape to the meditative rhythm of his footsteps.



The humble act of walking has a significant place in our Christian heritage. Christian pilgrims began to walk the European pilgrimage route know as the Camino de Santiago somewhere around 950 CE. Last year, 2023, almost half a million people from all over the world walked one of the half a dozen routes to Santiago de Compostella, Spain, know collectively as the Camino de Santiago. This summer, I walked the majority of the "French route" of the Camino, starting from Pamplona in North eastern Spain to the cathedral in Santiago in north western Spain, a journey of 720 Kilometers or 450 miles over 31 days.

On **Wednesday, September 4th at 6pm** at the home of Melanie Gillette (4352 Piedmont Dr. San Diego, Ca 92107) I'll be sharing thoughts about the ups and downs - both literal and figurative - of this journey, it's impact on my faith and the words and the reflections that kept me walking 12 to 18 miles a day, day after day.

You are invited to come listen, ask questions, and perhaps share a pilgrimage experience of your own. Please bring a friend, your favorite beverage, a snack and your stories as we share pilgrimage experiences and the sunset.
