Countdown with Prayers, Poetry, and Photos

If you're reading this newsletter by email, you've likely started getting an email every day with a prayer or poem as we move closer to the election. During anxious times, thank God for the faithful witness of those who have gone before us, who have lived through wars and famine, from whom we gain wisdom and courage.

On Day 38, we hear the guidance of our UCC ancestor, Rev. Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr, who is known for, but rarely credited for, the Serenity Prayer:

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, Courage to change the things I can, And wisdom to know the difference.

In his prayer on Day 15, renowned scholar and UCC pastor Rev. Dr. Walter Brueggemann, said, "When the world spins crazy... toward rage and hate and violence... we thank you for our rootage in communities of faith, for our many fathers and mothers who have believed and trusted as firm witnesses to us, for their many stories of wonder, awe, and healing... because we learn the world again always has a chance for life and sense and wholeness."

Some days, like Day 16, we're asked to pause with a simple prayer like this from Edwina Gately: "Quiet. Still. Be." Or to recite the mantra of Julian of Norwich on Day 11: "All shall be well. And all shall be well. And all manner of things shall be well."

What the world needs from us during these 40 days may be summed up in the words of Pope Francis on Day 5: "Where there is shouting, let us practice listening. Where there is confusion, let us inspire harmony. Where there is hostility, let us bring respect. Where there is prejudice, let us awaken trust."

On the day after the election, we will pray with UCC author and spiritual director, Rev. Jane Vennard, who is also my spiritual director, "Some of us are celebrating, grace us with humility in our victory. Some of us are mourning, grace us with compassion in our loss... Be with us as we work to create harmony in this divided world. We ask this in the name of all that is Holy."

May it be so!

Pastor David has suggested trying out a monthly: "Lunch with Pastor David".


Bring a lunch to the Commons on **Wednesday**, **October 9**th at noon to share lunch together with Pastor David and other members.

Our October Monthly Mission Partner is the national UCC's Neighbors in Need collection. This year the Neighbors in Need theme is "**Mental Health Justice For All!**" A just world for all is a world where the human rights and well-being of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey.

One-third of the offering supports <u>Council for Ameri-</u> can Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds are used

by <u>Justice and Witness Ministries</u> to provide <u>grants</u> to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects.

Last Step to Ordination

Our church family is invited to attend the Southern Association UCC Fall Meeting on **Sunday October 6 at 3 pm in our sanctuary**. As their final step before being ordained, two of our members, Ken Jensen and Barbara Christensen will each have their "Ecclesiastical Council." This is an opportunity for our members and members of all UCC churches in our area to listen to and approve of their ordination, which can then be held once they have been called to a ministry setting. Both candidates, MHUCC's Members in Discernment, would appreciate the support of their home congregation.

MHUCC is part of the Southern Association of the Southern California Nevada Conference of the UCC. Bruce Ramet is the Association Moderator. The meeting will both be in person and on Zoom. Refreshments will be served afterward where you can meet other UCC members around San Diego.

Candidates already in the ordination process can choose between writing a traditional ordination paper or using the new "Marks Portfolio" system.

September Youth Group Activities

In San Diego County, I Love a Clean San Diego organizes Coastal Cleanup Day with support from the California Coastal Commission, who organizes this effort statewide. This is all part of the greater International Coastal Cleanup that's led by the Ocean Conservancy.This year our Youth Group joined the effort. We cleared trash from South Juniper Canyon removing more than 200lb of discarded food containers and wrap-

We made holiday ornaments, which will be used to raise money for JFS, and then we went to Lefty's for pizza.

Advent Book

Labor Day, the symbolic end of summer, is past. Fall officially started about a week ago. So, of course, that means the Big Box stores will soon be sporting Christmas paraphernalia squeezed in with Halloween and Thanksgiving décor. That does make us chuckle and shake our heads.

But in all honesty, it's not too early to start thinking about the Christmas season and, in particular, MHUCC's **ADVENT BOOK**. For those of you newer to the church, the **ADVENT BOOK** is a cherished part of the Christmas holiday season. For each day of the Advent season, the church issues a story written by one of YOU to inspire and remind us of the true meaning of Christmas and the coming of Christ into our lives.

You may realize that you have something in common with someone you didn't know well. And then, suddenly, we are connected to each other and to God.

To paraphrase scripture, "... seek and ye shall find."






Meeting Minutes
