Highlights of 2024

The highlights of 2024 include some of our annual traditions like the Souper Bowl, building a house in Tijuana, services for Holy Week and Easter, including what has become an annual tradition of a Palm Sunday Procession along Fort Stockton with our friends at MH United Methodist Church. Plus, a booth at the summer concert series, Church in Park, Blessing of the Backpacks, Animal Blessing, All Saints Day, Thanksgiving Feast, and our third Christmas Carol Camp. And don't forget the All Generations Weekend at Pilgrim Pines. The list continues with regular ongoing ministry, such as monthly Feeding Mission Hills and so much more.

Some of the highlights were unique to 2024: We celebrated the centennial of our organ and commissioned a new hymn and choral piece, the inauguration of the Second Saturday Series focused on issues and interests of older adults along with many other programs of the new Life Stages Team, a new joint ownership agreement of the Green Manor board resulting in the creation of a new entity called Green Vistas with \$53 million to build new affordable senior housing, and a memorable All Generations Homecoming Sock Hop. The list could continue. And oh, my goodness, how could I leave out the choir trip to New York City and singing from the stage of Carnegie Hall! Which doubled attendance at the annual choir concert with 202 people packing the sanctuary.

Our ministry is full of vibrancy and life and this shows through your participation in the above programs and your generosity. Worship attendance is strong. With average attendance near 120 in-person, we are one of only 8% of UCC churches with more than 100 people in worship. Plus, we have many more who worship online – some live and many more in the following week.

Now that the 2024 financial numbers have been finalized, we have more to celebrate. Instead of taking \$25,000 from the Pilgrim Fund to balance the budget, we had a surplus and will grow the Pilgrim Fund by \$8,288. Unpledged offerings were 249% of budget and 98.6% of pledges were fulfilled. All of that is on top of \$41,000 for our mission partners – which is part of the \$80,000 the church gave beyond our walls in 2024. For the organ centennial, we set a goal of \$20,000 to complete some improvement projects on the organ. That goal was met. And the surprise opportunity for the choir to go to Carnegie Hall received \$45,000 to support it. The endowment has grown from \$500,000 in 2017 to \$921,000 today. And designated funds for special projects contain \$130,000 – helped by a generous \$50,000 personal gift from the broker who worked with Green Manor. It's been designated for our building fund, soon to be renamed our Capital Reserve Fund.

In 2025, the youth group is adding a spiritual weekend at Camp Stevens. We are taking a Civil Rights Pilgrimage to Alabama and Atlanta. A new weekly after school program is underway. The first segment: MHUCC Chef's Academy has 14 students from Grant. And we are adding an Easter Eve vigil from 6:30 pm to 6:30 am.

We have momentum. We still face the headwinds of decline all around us in Christian churches, but I believe we are taking all the right steps to serve our current members and adapt to what people not yet part of our congregation are looking for that we can provide well. Serving as the pastor of people who do not act (re-act) out of fear, especially around money, makes a huge difference. HUGE. So thank you.
