Sound healing is an ancient wellness practice for healing, relaxation, and self-care. For thousands of years sound has been used to heal and balance many aspects of our lives. In fact, research demonstrates that sounds consist of vibrations that affect us on a cellular level, impacting multi-dimensional brain, nerve, muscle, and organ function to improve our well-being and reduce stress.

Melissa Nolan, Licensed Acupuncturist, Herbalist, Certified Sound Healing Therapist, and martial artist will be leading us through a Sound Healing session in the coziness our Chapel space. While chairs will be set up, feel free to bring your own yoga mat, pillow, and blanket to lie on the floor for a more relaxing experience.

 March 24 Lenten Monday #3 — Healing Touch with Lisa Goodman 6:30-7:30pm, In The Chapel

 March 31 Lenten Monday #4 — The History of Prayer & Anointing in the Christian Church with Rev. Courtney Mys, 6:30-7:30pm, In The Chapel

Exploring the roots of Divine healing in the early Christian church is a journey back to a time where faith and miracles intertwined seamlessly. Early believers embraced the power of prayer, laying on of hands, and the anointing of oil, believing firmly in the healing promises of God.

Experiencing her own personal healing experience with anointing and prayer that led her to go to seminary and become a pastor, Rev. Courtney Mys will share the history of the Christian healing service, the scriptural basis, and lead a discussion in how this early church practice continues to influence our contemporary practices today. This discussion will prepare us to experience a full healing and anointing service as a conclusion to our last week of Lent.

 April 7 Lenten Monday #5 — A Service of Prayer and Anointing with Rev. Courtney Mys & Harpist, 6:30-7:30pm, In The Chapel

Based on the scripture of James 5:14-15, "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord" all are invited to a Christian Service of Prayer and Anointing. Whether you or someone you know may be in need of healing and strengthening in body, mind, and spirit we invite you this reflective time in remembering "where two or more are gather in my name, I am with you" (Matthew 18:20). Surrounded and infilled with the power of the Holy Spirit and the healing vibrations of harp music, it is a time of centering, healing, and community connection.

History Corner - One Great Hour of Sharing



Many denominations participate in the annual One Great Hour of Sharing, connecting all of us to disaster relief, refugee assistance, and development efforts around the globe. When disasters strike, or when individuals are displaced due to violence or poverty, OGHS ensures immediate response and ongoing recovery. OGHS was begun in 1946 in response to the great needs facing many countries after WWII.

Looking back at our church's mission activities in the early '50's, we find that we too were focused on needs around the world. We sponsored "another fine family of refugees from behind the iron curtain, making possible their haven in Amer-

ica and their permanent establishment in San Diego." Also, "the church school collected 77 pounds of soap to be sent to Italy," and "more than 150 pairs of socks were sent to Korea."
