Holy Week and Easter

During a time of great upheaval in our country, the intentional practices of faith during Lent ground us in God's love and give us the strength and courage to be a witness for compassion and mercy.

Our focus on healing this Lenten season has been especially rich and well received. Pastor Courtney's Monday night series began with 42 people squeezing into the chapel for Sound Healing – like a symphony of singing bowls that touch the soul. The response was so overwhelmingly positive, we will offer this again on an ongoing basis.

This focus will continue during worship on Sunday, April 6. It has become our practice that on the last Sunday of Lent before Palm Sunday, our service includes a moment for anointing with oil. Then the next night, Monday, April 7 at 6:30, we will hold a full service of anointing with a harpist playing original music in the chapel.

On **Palm Sunday**, April 13, bring your own palms at 9:30 and join in a procession on Fort Stockton with our friends at MH United Methodist Church. That afternoon at 1:30, you are invited back to MHUCC for a meeting of people in our UCC partnership churches who wish to be involved in racial justice activities.

Maundy Thursday will offer two services – one at Noon in the chapel, in person only. We will share the Last Supper together around a table. At 7 pm we will gather for our traditional "lessons and carols" type service, communion, and optional foot washing. The service ends by stripping the sanctuary and singing in darkness. Members of our partnership churches are invited to join us at either service. This service will also be livestreamed.

On **Good Friday** we will gather at Noon on Zoom only. If you would like an in person service, The Table UCC in La Mesa invites you to join them at 6:30 pm.

We have a new option for **Holy Saturday**. We will hold an overnight vigil in the sanctuary from 6:30 pm Saturday until sunrise on Easter morning. We will be asking for people to commit to a 2 hour "shift," so please think about whether you are able, for example, to stay awake from 2-4 am. Remember, Jesus asked his disciples to stay awake while he went off to pray and they kept falling asleep. No pressure!

Finally, on **Easter morning**, we will gather at sunrise (a little after since it is at 6:13 am this year) at the United Methodist Church.

Our big festival worship with brass and choir is at 10 am. Come early to make sure you get a seat!

And following worship, we will have our traditional Easter Egg Hunt. You can help by providing individually wrapped candy. Please bring by Palm Sunday. The youth group will assemble and hide the eggs. Oh, and we need plastic egg holders this year!

We will observe Earth Day on the last Sunday of April.

The Altadena Community Church, United Church of Christ, was destroyed in the blaze.

In April 1947, 78 Years ago, our church began a new building project. This 2-story 45' x 85' building would be referred to as the "Church Annex."

It would include a nursery, church school rooms, office, Pastor's study, ladies parlor, gym or recreation hall, and a small chapel. This was a major expansion for a growing church. The project, later referred to as the Religious Education and Recreation Building, and was completed in 1950.

Youth and Tweens: SSP Summer Camp

We are planning to take a group of youth and tweens (2025/2026 6th grade and above) to participate in the Sierra Service Project (SSP) camp in San Diego South Bay, August 3 – 9. Our group will join middle and high school groups from other churches to work on community-led projects (such as habitat restoration in the Tijuana River Estuary and on Silver Strand State Beach) and traditional SSP repair work such as painting, rebuilding fences, building decks and wheelchair ramps, and other home repairs for very low-income families or seniors. No construction experience is needed, youth and tweens will be trained to use power tools safely.

The camp will be hosted at the National City First United Methodist Church and will include all meals and accommodation for the week. The camp costs \$715 per person; scholarships **are available from SSP and MHUCC.**


