In this time of instability, fear, and despair, there are a lot of people who feel isolated and hopeless. We have something powerful to give. It is incumbent upon all of us to spread the word that in the middle of our polarized times there is still hope and joy – and a place to belong. MHUCC has particular strengths to offer as an expression of our love, especially during a period where the loudest Christian voices preach exclusion. We cannot be a place of support only for ourselves, so how can we spread the word more widely and clearly? Church Council has embraced the following strategy as a place to begin.

As our first step, you will receive an email with a series of questions that will require thoughtful reflection – not a quick survey. We ask for the gift of your time. We will then invite people to participate in small group discussion of the results. In advance of the survey, here are five statements and questions to give you a little time to begin thinking about it:

- 1) There is hope in a world that may feel quite hopeless right now.

 What are MHUCC's unique gifts that give you hope in this world?
- 2) Community is vitally important when the world feels polarized.

 How is MHUCC welcoming? What are the unique opportunities for community that MHUCC provides well? What are we missing?
- 3) Joy is an act of resistance against despair. How do you find this true at MHUCC? How do we best communicate this to others?
- 4) There are spiritual communities including LGBTQ-affirming churches that provide *unconditional* welcome and a message of *social justice*.

For you, what are MHUCC's key values? How do we best communicate this

5) Our church – the Christian faith – provides *spiritual resources* for how you are feeling right now.

What spiritual resources does MHUCC provide to you? What is missing?

Our strength is our members who know better than anyone what people find at MHUCC. We want to empower you to share that message. We will then translate our experiences into language for *younger adults* and *anyone of any age* without a church home. Part of that

translation is a new logo to align our look with our values, a new website – because the first impression matters – and the increased use of social media to drive people to our website, to learn about us, to watch our services – some of whom will choose to participate online and others who will join us in person. Someone doesn't have to be in our sanctuary to feel hope, joy, and affirmation. And finally, after six months, an assessment of our efforts and what are our next steps.

I'm excited by this comprehensive first step. Beyond completing the survey and participating in a discussion group, would you like to know more about how to be involved in this effort? Let me know!

Sierra Service Project Camp

Students entering 6th - 12th grade: We still have openings for you to join us for summer camp and a service opportunity Sunday, August 3 – Saturday, August 9 in San Diego South Bay

Our group will join middle and high school groups from other churches to work on community-led projects (such as habitat restoration in the Tijuana River Estuary and on Silver Strand State Beach) and traditional SSP repair work such as painting, rebuilding fences, building decks and wheelchair ramps, and other home repairs for very low-income families or seniors. No construction experience is needed.

The camp will be hosted at the National City First United Methodist Church and will include all meals and accommodation for the week. The camp costs \$715 per person; scholarships are available from SSP and MHUCC.

The MHUCC youth group has a long history of participating in SSP. In our most recent trip, in 2023, we took a group of 5 boys to volunteer at their program in Sacramento. You can get a feeling for that trip from our video, and a more general feel for the program from the SSP Invitation video, both of which are linked from our website.

Families who already expressed interest: I will be sending out registration forms next week.



History Corner - Where Shall We Meet?

In the earliest years of our church, the Board of Trustees (about 6 men) was the major governing body, dealing with a variety of issues such as building projects, budgets, stewardship, . . . Throughout the 1920's, the Board met in restaurants where they could dine and conduct business. Their first location was the Cabrillo Café on 6th St., downtown.



Then beginning in 1928, they moved to the Waldorf Café in North Park, where weekday lunches cost \$0.35. This building, located at 3140 University Ave., later became the iconic Waldorf Television Building, - the first television store in San Diego. (pictured on the left)

In 1931, the meetings moved to the Hotel Churchill, corner of 9th and C St. This building is now an affordable housing development. In 1937, the Board began holding meetings at the church. Meetings of the Board of Trustees and the Council continued to meet in the church for the next 83 years. In 2020, the Pandemic forced us all to adapt to ZOOM meetings, which are now our preferred meeting style.

May Mission Partner - El Nido

The most dangerous time for victims of domestic violence is when they try to leave their abuser.

Interfaith Shelter Network's El Nido Transitional Living Program provides a haven for single women and women with children who are fleeing domestic violence. Program participants partner with a skilled and compassionate case manager to create personalized plans to achieve self-sufficiency for themselves and their children.

DV families have complex needs to recover from the ravages of domestic violence. El Nido Program participants receive on-site case management and psychological counseling, financial planning, housing search and life skills classes and referrals to additional services, such as legal assistance programs, medical and dental services, educational programs such as ESL and GED, job training and employment readiness programs. Survivors recover from trauma, build skills and incomes, and acquire permanent housing for their families. This is up to 12 months program stay.
